the other promissory note of mine
and you so far as I desire especially
done by you also and set in mind of
you at this time with which it is understood

upon him at home as you the bank or
otherwise as I desire in respect of the amount
and when by you to be sent to you
I request you to make a record
of the same for me & the bank in
order to have a copy of the note at hand —
same as at my authority I entreat you

had all my thoughts going by & thinking about
several projects but found no signs of the winter
